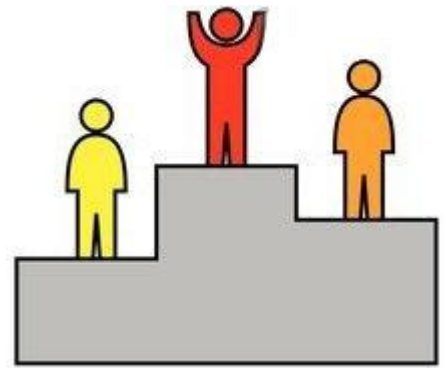

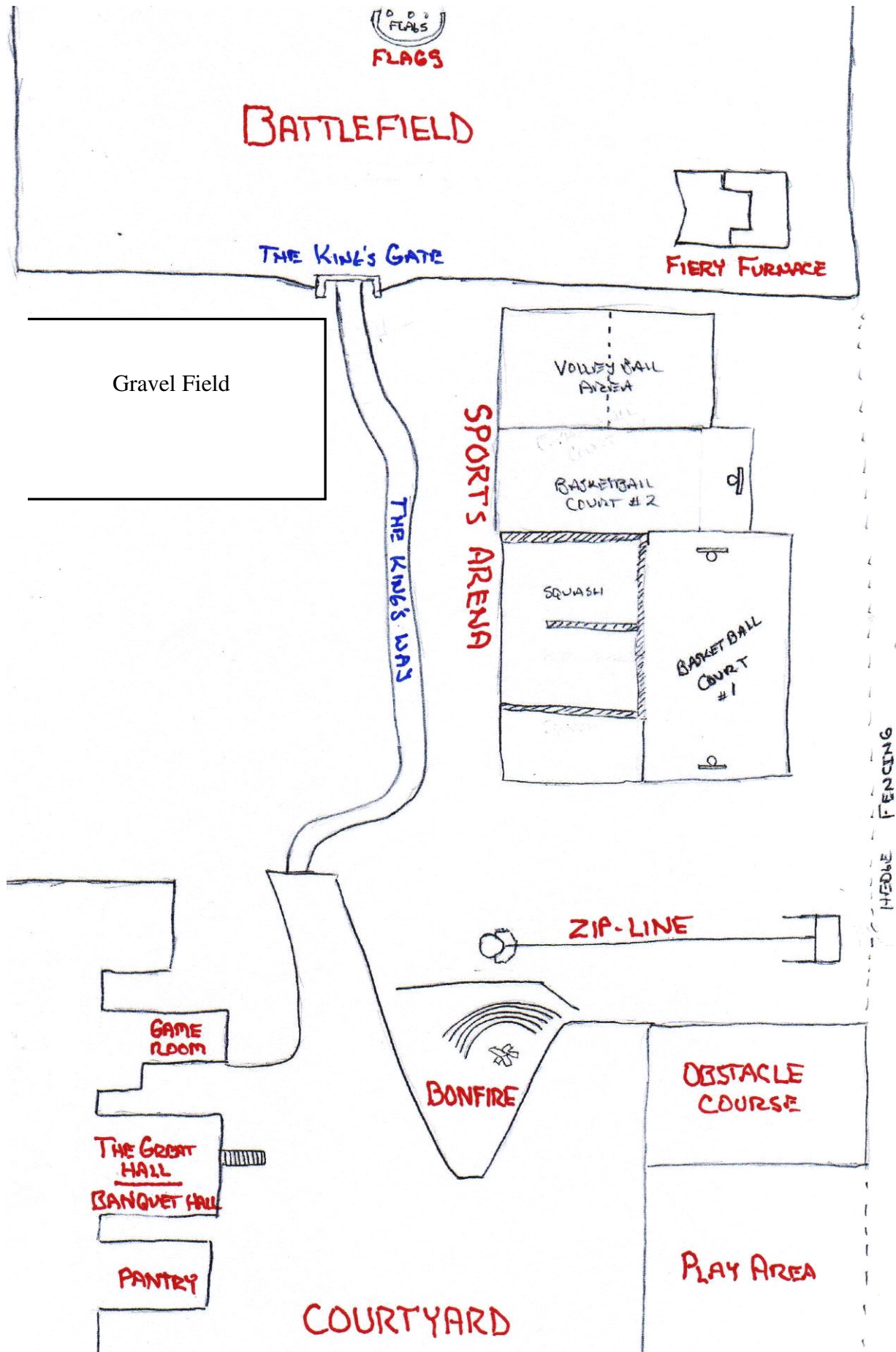

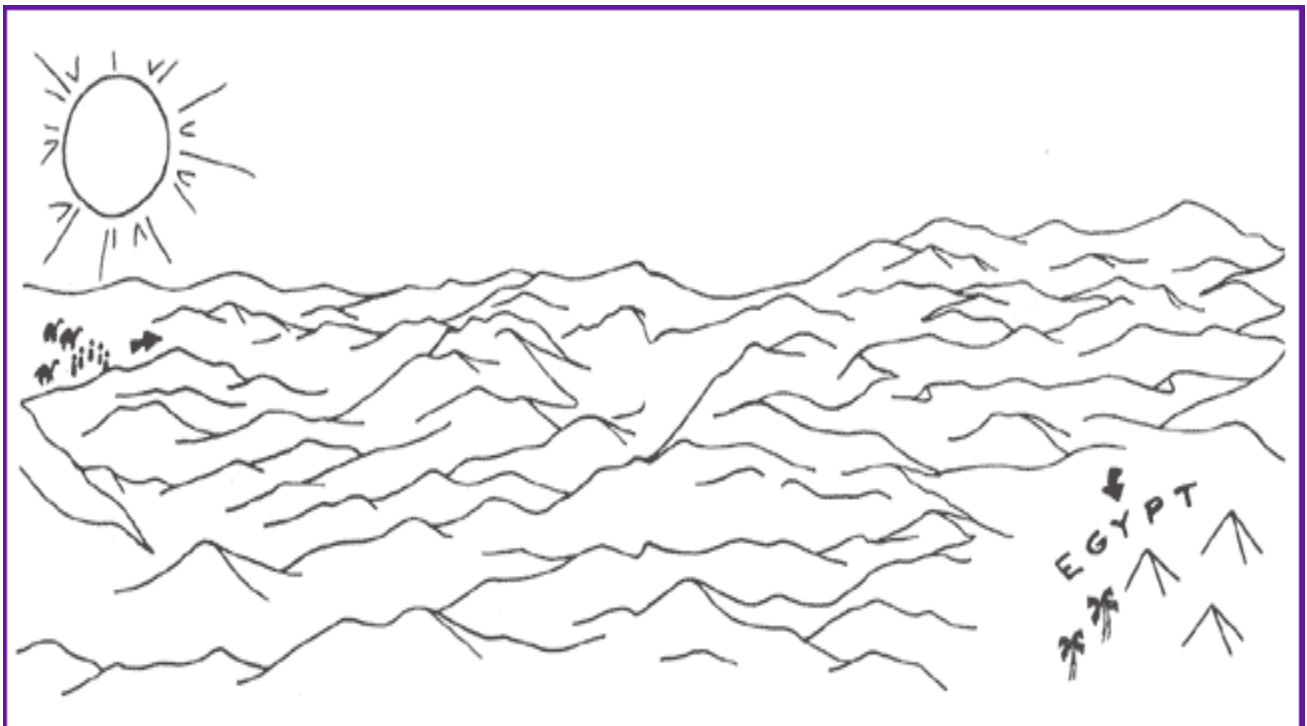
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Rules You Have to Obey While At Camp

1. The Camp Director and leaders will be obeyed at all times.
2. No one is allowed to go outside of the Camp grounds without permission from the Camp Director – period!
3. All mobiles will be turned into either your pastor, or to the Camp Director upon arrival at camp. Use of mobile phones will be allowed once a day and will be strictly monitored. If you are using a mobile phone inappropriately, then you risk losing it, and you will lose points for both yourself, and your team. If your parents need to contact you, they must ring either your pastor or the Camp Director.
4. Keep your Camper Handbook, put your name on it – don't lose it!
5. Don't leave your stuff lying around.
6. Keep your hands off other people's stuff.
7. Every meal, a team will be selected to wash the dishes and clean the dining hall – do your tasks without complaining – the better the attitude, the more the points!
8. No profanity will be allowed.
9. No rock or worldly music will be played at all at camp – Camp Director decides
10. No *boy and girl* things going on.
11. No knives – if you have one, give it to your pastor, or to the Camp Director until Camp is over and he will return it.
12. No smoking.
13. No going behind the buildings, or going out through the windows.
14. No guys going into girl's rooms, and no girls going into the guy's room – ever!
15. No one except adults are allowed into the Adult rooms.

How to Earn Points

Getting Points

- Every Scripture verse you memorize, YOU get 100 points!
- If you memorize all the 5 key verses you get 500 Extra points!
- If you memorize ALL the verses, you will get 2,000 extra points on top of them!
- The first full team present and seated for Chapel gets 500 points! Every time!
- Every Team Cheer, or Skit will get points for that team based on how good they are!
- Every time your team wins a sports activity, your whole team gets 1000 points! Some sports activities will not be point-based.
- Clean Bunks will result in 100 points being given to the person
- A completed Bible Word Dictionary will result in 1,000 points for that person.
- Every Sermon or lesson that you take a full page of notes on will get you 500 pts
- Every Devotion Page completed will get 500 points
- Every time the Camp Director sees a person with great zeal, they will get 500 pts
- Every young camper who finishes making a Craft will get 1,000 points!
- Every bed at inspection that is extra clean and tidy could get 100 points.

Losing Points – unless stated, breaking any of these rules has a limit of three warnings

- Every time someone on your team has a bad attitude, breaks a rule, or gets into a fight, they will lose 1000 points.
- Every bed must be made and every room cleaned before breakfast – or else each person who leaves a messy bunk will lose 100 points.
- Arguing with a camp leader/counsellor will cost you 500 points.
- No one ever goes out of the camp unless they are given permission by the Camp Director. If you leave camp grounds without permission, you will be sent home.
- No boy is ever allowed in a girl's room, and no girl is ever allowed in a boy's room. If you disobey this rule, you may be sent home.
- No one is allowed to mess with the windows in the rooms, or with the thermostats. Do not touch the fire alarms!
- Everyone must obey their team leader and the camp counsellors at all times.
- Anyone caught doing intentional damage to the camp will have to pay for it, and may be sent home
- Anyone going out of their room after curfew, or before 6am **will be sent home.**
- Anyone with more than three warnings will be sent home.
- Anyone caught messing with the fire alarms will be sent home!!!!

How to memorize God's Word... Read each verse *out-loud* 5 times – while waiting in line for dinner, while combing or brushing your hair, or while getting ready for bed. Memorize it word-perfect (don't leave out any words). It also helps to break a long verse into smaller parts so you don't have too much to remember all in one go!

Tuesday Devotion - Losing Your Coat of Many Colours



Read Genesis 37:2-11, 18-24

Joseph was born into a large family. He had ten older brothers, and one older sister. Only his brother Benjamin was younger than him. When Joseph was born, he became the joy of his father. He was his father's favourite son! Yet as a young boy, trouble came into Joseph's life. His mother died right after giving birth to his brother, Benjamin.

Once Rachel died, Jacob poured his love onto Joseph and Benjamin. They became his cherished sons over the rest of his children. Jacob so treasured Joseph that he made him a coat of many colours. It was such a beautiful and magnificent coat! Joseph's brothers grew very jealous of Joseph because of the love and favour that their father showered him with. Even though he was 17 years old, he was not doing the bad things his brothers were doing, and even told his father what his brothers were doing wrong. His brothers soon became so hateful of Joseph that they were mean to him whenever they spoke to him.

One day Joseph had a dream and when he told his dream to his brothers, they became very upset with him. He then had another dream and when he told it to his family, even his father became upset. Joseph didn't understand what the dreams meant, but his older brothers took it that Joseph would one day take all the inheritance and rule over them. His brothers finally had enough and came up with a plan to get rid of Joseph once and for all. They sold him into slavery and took his beautiful coat and ripped it to shreds and put goat's blood all over it so that it looked like he was attacked by a lion. How do you think Joseph must have felt when his brothers treated him that way?

Wednesday Devotion - What Does Integrity Look Like?

Definition of Integrity: Integrity is having moral soundness, living purely, incorruptible, uprightness, and living honestly. Integrity is not something that magically happens overnight. Instead it is a character trait that needs to be developed. Joseph was taught by his father to trust in the Lord and live purely. Joseph did not have the greatest examples of integrity in his brothers, but as a young man decided to develop this character trait in his life. Integrity is doing the right things when either others are doing the wrong things or when temptation comes to do the wrong things. Integrity is developed by having a close walk with God. Integrity can also be defined as what a person does when no one is watching.

Introduction: Joseph had just been sold into slavery. He was scared, alone, and not sure what would happen to him next. He ends up getting sold to Potiphar, the Egyptian. He could have let his circumstance destroy him, but he served Potiphar as if he was serving God Himself. Joseph could have been lazy, slothful, or rebellious – but he wasn't! Joseph worked hard and God blessed him for his faithfulness to Potiphar. Potiphar took note of this and promoted Joseph to over his entire household. He trusted Joseph with every detail of his finances and business. He knew that Joseph wouldn't rob or steal from him, because of the integrity Joseph showed in his life. The greatest test of Joseph's integrity came when Potiphar's wife tempted him to be immoral with her. She would not leave him alone and daily tempted him. Joseph could have given in, but his integrity and love for God kept him from sinning with her.

Thursday's Devotion - *Being Faithful*

Introduction: Genesis chapters 39-41 tell the low and high points of Joseph's Egyptian slavery and imprisonment. He spent eleven years as a slave, and two as a prisoner before he suddenly became the Governor of Egypt. As he sought to trust and obey God during that terribly lonely, desolate time, things went from bad to worse. Joseph desired to serve Potiphar as was honoring to God. Egypt was a land of pagan idols and gods and was very foreign to the One God that Joseph served. As he served God faithfully in Potiphar's house, he was falsely accused of trying to rape Potiphar's wife. Potiphar threw him into the prison and wouldn't listen to the innocent pleas of Joseph. How easy it could have been for Joseph to give up on God! He probably wondered many times why God was allowing him to go through these troubles. Yet, for two long years in prison, Joseph continued to be faithful to God.

Even in prison, Joseph was a servant and faithful to any task he was given. The keeper of the prison saw how dependable and trustworthy Joseph was and commended the prison into his hands! Can you imagine a jailor giving a prisoner the keys to all the prison cells and knowing that Joseph would not start up a rebellion or insurrection? It was during these eleven years of serving Potiphar and two years serving the jailor that God was moulding Joseph into becoming a leader of the nation of Egypt. It would take a man of principle, trustworthiness, and integrity to manage all the food that was taken in during the seven years of plenty and then dispersing that food during the seven years of famine. In **Luke 16:10**, the Bible says: "*He that is faithful in that which is least is faithful also in much: and he that is unjust in the least is unjust also in much.*" The years that Joseph was faithful in serving men in things that were least was proving to God that He could trust Joseph to be faithful in managing a nation and all the power that was given to him. Also, in **1 Corinthians 4:2**, the Bible says: "*Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful.*" A steward is someone who serves another or takes care of another's belongings. We are all stewards of the things that God has given us. They really are His, but He lets us take care of them. God requires us to be faithful to Him above anyone else!

Friday Devotion - Forgiveness is Expensive

It had been over 20 years since Joseph saw his brothers, and now his brothers were standing right in front of him. They had travelled to Egypt to get food because of the famine. Joseph recognized all his brothers immediately, but they did not know who he was. This was Joseph's chance to finally get even and pay his brothers back for what they did to him! But, is that what Joseph did? Joseph had the power to get even with his mean brothers, but instead he chose to forgive them.

What is forgiveness? To forgive someone is to stop feeling resentment against someone who has done you wrong, and to put that hurt away from you and out of your life. Forgiving someone is not an easy thing to do, especially if someone really hurt you. It is even harder to forgive someone when they KEEP hurting you. When you choose to forgive someone, you are choosing to also forget what they have done to you. God has done the same for us. We hurt God all the time when we disobey Him and sin. When Jesus died upon the cross, one of the last things He prayed was for His Father to forgive those who crucified Him. **Hebrews 10:17** says *"And their sins and iniquities will I remember no more."* When we ask God to forgive us for our sin, and trust Jesus as our Saviour, God forgives us for EVERYTHING we ever have done against Him. He even goes further than that. He chooses to not ever remember them again. To truly forgive someone is to decide not to remember how bad they hurt you. When we choose NOT to forgive people, the one we are hurting the most is ourselves. When we don't forgive, we begin to get angry, mean, and bitter against those who hurt us and we end up lashing out at them or wanting to hurt them back. This is NOT how a Christian is to live. Can Jesus forgive you for everything you did wrong in your life? It cost Jesus the pain and death of the cross! He willingly died in our place on the cross because He wanted to completely forgive you. We are to take that example as our own and to forgive others no matter how bad they hurt us! Only when we forgive does peace come to our hearts.
