Introducing Lot Genesis 11 – Genesis 19

Lot's Heritage & Wise Decision (Genesis 11:10-32)

The world-wide flood had taken place. Noah and his family emerged from the ark to a completely new world. Given the command to spread out and replenish the earth, the sons of Noah did just that. All three had many children and civilization continues on. Lot was a descendant of Noah's son, Shem. He was born in the land of Ur of the Chaldees (Babylon) to Abraham's brother, Haran. Lot had nearly the same background as Abraham and came from a very pagan culture. Lot's father died in Ur and Lot was unofficially adopted by

his uncle, Abraham. Lot's grandfather, Terah, decided to leave Ur, along with Abraham, Sarah, and Lot. They eventually settled in a place called Haran.

After Terah dies, Abraham is called by God to leave Haran and to leave his family behind, except for Sarah. Abraham followed God, and Lot made the right decision in following his uncle. He had enough faith to believe in Abraham's God and to follow Abraham's faith. This bit of faith made him righteous in God's eyes (2Peter 2:7,8). And even though God was already blessing Abraham with material wealth, Abraham never focused on it – but Lot did.

From Haran to Egypt (Genesis 12)

As they are in Canaan, a great famine hit the country and Abraham decided to travel to and live in Egypt and out of the will of God. Lot continued with Abraham and got his first taste of

the world's pleasures and riches. Abraham was afraid of Pharaoh and of the Egyptians for Sarah's sake and tried to deceive Pharaoh to protect himself. Sarah is taken into Pharaoh's house and Pharaoh blesses Abraham with great wealth for her. God then plagued Pharaoh and his house for this and Pharaoh realised the lie that Abraham told him, and demanded that Abraham leave Egypt. Abraham's deceit was a poor testimony to his nephew Lot.





Lot's Disastrous Decision (Genesis 13)

Abraham travels back to Bethel with Sarah and Lot and gets right with God. At this point, he is very rich in cattle, silver, and gold. Lot has also benefitted with great wealth for being with Abraham, but he never got his own relationship with God restored. Soon after settling back in Bethel, trouble arises between the shepherds of Abraham and Lot. They had accumulated so many herds that the land was unable to bear them both. Abraham offers a decision to Lot to make and gives him the first pick of

wherever he would like to go. Instead of asking for Abraham's advice, Lot looks upon the wellwatered plains of Jordan and sees the prosperity that he can achieve there. Now Lot gets to choose his own way. The plains of Jordan remind him of Egypt and he leaves to settle there, pitching his tent toward Sodom and the prosperity that city may give him. Even before he left, Lot knew that those men who lived in Sodom were very wicked and sinners before the Lord exceedingly. Lot made the mistake thinking that their sin would not affect him and that he was stronger than that type of lifestyle.

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The War of Kings (Genesis 14)

Soon, he is proven wrong and Lot is no longer living in the plains of Jordan and has moved to the city of Sodom. The first ever war mentioned in the Bible erupts

around him and Sodom is captured. Lot is taken captive, along with his family and possessions. God would scarcely have bothered to record this pagan dog fight between nine heathen countries, were it not for these four words – "and they took Lot"! Lot still belonged to God even though Lot didn't act like it. A man who escaped from being captured finds Abraham and tells him what has happened. Abraham immediately decides to rescue his nephew with 318 trained servants who were born under Abraham's ownership. After a forced march with his allies, Abraham attacks by night with his small group against the huge army of the kings who had taken Lot captive and conquers them all. Lot is rescued and returns to Sodom with his recovered family and possessions. The amazing thing is, Abraham even rescues the wicked sinners of Sodom who also were captured. Sadly, what is disheartening about Lot is how he refused to leave the plains of Jordan even after his deliverance from captivity.



Abraham Pleads for Sodom (Genesis 18) and especially for Lot

After Lot spends the next thirteen years dwelling in Sodom, three visitors come to Abraham. The visitors are a pre-incarnation of Jesus Christ with two angels. They have first come to tell Abraham that he and Sarah will have a son within the year and will be fulfilling God's promise to them. As they begin to leave, God informs Abraham about what He is planning on doing to Sodom and Gomorrah because of their very grievous sin. He knew that Abraham has prayed for Lot and his family for many years and that he was burdened for his nephew to live for God. Abraham intercedes on Lot's

behalf several times while talking to God and finally asks God to spare those cities if there were ten righteous people living in them. Abraham surely thought that Lot and his family were enough for that number and that Lot had raised his family to live righteously and to love and fear God.


The Filth & Destruction of Sodom (Genesis 19:1-29)

That evening, the two angels come to Sodom and find Lot sitting at the gate, now an influential person in the city. As soon as Lot sees them, he bows before them and requests them to stay at his home for the evening. The angels were planning on staying in the streets that night to see the wickedness firsthand, but Lot presses upon them greatly to stay in his home, and they finally concede. Lot knows the danger these men are



in if they stay in the street and the wickedness that would come upon them by the men of the city. Lot prepares them a great meal and everything appears to be going well for Lot and his guests.

Then the voices start to call from outside his door. While they had been eating, the men of the city, both young and old from every area in Sodom surrounded Lot's house. They had heard there were two men who had arrived into Sodom that had never been there before. These men were so wicked and perverse that they demanded Lot to hand over the angels to them so they could sexually abuse them. Lot comes out and shuts the door behind him, and entreats the

men that they do not harm the men inside his house. He even calls them his brethren! Lot even offers his two virgin daughters for them to sexually gang rape and abuse instead of the two men. The men rebuke Lot and begin pressing in upon him to harm him as well. Yet, the angels rescue Lot and pull him into the house. They inflict blindness upon all the men that came out to surround the house and the wicked men could not even find the door.

The angels know that their time is fast running out and that it is true what they have been told about Sodom. They then tell Lot what is going to happen to Sodom and Gomorrah and the regions surrounding these wicked cities. They ask if Lot has any other family in the city and for Lot to get them out of the city. Lot goes to his daughters and son-in-laws homes and warns them about the coming destruction. His son-in-laws laugh him to scorn and think he's joking with them. Sadly, Lot's compromising destroyed his integrity before his family.





Finally, as dawn starts to approach, Lot returns alone to his home. The angels hasten Lot to take his wife and two daughters out of the city. Lot delays so long that the angels end up grabbing their hands and brought them out of the city. The angels warn Lot to flee to the mountains and to not look back. Lot still does not believe that God will protect him and negotiates with the angels to spare the city of Zoar, so that he can go there instead. The angels agree to Lot's request and wait for Lot to leave so that the cities could be destroyed.

Lot's Tragic End (Genesis 19:30-38)

As soon as Lot and his family enter Zoar, the Lord rained fire and brimstone upon the cities and destroyed them completely. So complete was their destruction that no trace of Sodom or the other cities of the plain have been discovered. As the destruction was taking place, Lot's wife disobeyed the angel and looked back upon Sodom. She immediately turned into a pillar of salt. As the destruction went on, Lot leaves Zoar and goes into the mountains, allowing his fear to overrule his faith in God's protection and promise. Had he





stayed in Zoar, his daughters would not have considered their perverted sin that was influenced by their time in Sodom. Since they thought they were the last humans on earth, they decide to get their father drunk and commit incest with him to preserve the seed of mankind. Their sin would conceive into two children being born, and these children's descendants would always be the enemies of the nation of Israel. Sadly, the life of Lot ended in such a waste. Lot fled from God's promises and is never heard from again. Lot was a man who knew great prosperity, prestige, and praise and would end up losing everything he had because of his compromise with the world.

Lot – A Life Lived by Wrong Choices

Genesis 13:10,11 "Then Lot chose..."

Every believer has choices to make, and must consider the God ordained consequences as well as the benefits of every one of our choices! KNOW THE FRUITS, not just the FUN!

Lot always made his decisions 'on the fly' never realizing he would one day have to face all the consequences of those choices along with all the shame, guilt and regret! If you want a good 'end' you need to be making right choices along the way!

See if you can figure which choices that Lot made were wrong, and which were right.

- R W Lot chose to believe and trust the God of Abraham
- R W He chose to leave Ur and to go to the Promised Land
- R W He chose to follow Abraham into Egypt when famine struck Canaan

- R W He made the decision to never build his own altar to personally worship God himself (but just rely on Abraham's spirituality)

- R W He chose to return to Sodom after having been captured by 4 kings and armies
- R W He decided to compromise his standards as a father and a husband in order to make more money in Sodom
- R W He chose to treat visitors better than his own family
- R W Lot chose to let his own daughters be abused by an angry mob outside his home
- R W He decided to linger in Sodom even though he knew God's judgment was about to fall
- R W He chose to push for God to let him and his daughters stay in Zoar instead of flee to the mountains
- R W He chose to get drunk in his depression after the destruction of Sodom, instead of get right with God
- R W Lot chose to finally flee to the mountains from Zoar after Sodom was destroyed

The only way to KEEP from making all these same WRONG choices is to make ONE right choice at the start of every new day... Romans 13:14, "But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to fulfil the lusts thereof."

A Man's Quiet Time How Does a Real Man Walk with His God?

Please read this simple explanation of how to prepare your heart for a daily serious time with God through His word. It will make all the difference in the world to come humbly before the throne of grace. **Hebrews 4:16.** We need God's help!

Start with Prayer! Find yourself a place every day to get alone with God. Remember Matthew 6:6 "But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet..." It is when we are by ourselves seeking the Lord that we hear His still, small voice. Start with opening your heart to God. Allow Him to do an inspection of what is in your thoughts and feelings. Psalm 139:23 says, "Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts." Be honest with yourself, and honest with God. Ask God to search for any sins you may have buried in your heart. Psalm 139:24 says, "And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." David, realizing he had sinned against God, asked for a cleansing. God wants us all very clean in our hearts! Psalm 51:2 says, "Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin." Let God cleanse your life as you do the following three things: 1. Acknowledge - admit the sins He reveals are there in your heart. 2. Confess - admit that you have sinned before an all holy God. 3. Forsake - leave each sin, abandoning everything that has separated you from God. Decide by God's power to quit doing the same sins that God reveals to you in your quiet time, and has already forgiven, and cleansed you from. Remember the Lord's promise – 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Humble yourself. The Bible says in **Isaiah 57:15a**, "For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit..." We have a great need every day to humble ourselves as we prepare to walk with God. This means there must be a **personal brokenness** to cause us to always depend upon the Lord. God wants to fully "dwell" in our heart, but He will not force His way in, nor will He honour a sinful, wicked heart. Once your heart is clean, tell God you are coming under His perfect authority, and that you want to obey Him all day long. God desires to fellowship with you, but only with the right attitude!

<u>Tell God what you need!</u> Cast all your worries, cares, and every need upon Almighty God. He loves to answer our impossible prayers! He delights to have our strength renewed in our daily walk with Him. Believe God wants to give you a peace and strength far beyond what we are used to. So, pray about everything! Real men don't fight, get angry, frustrated, and defeated when things don't work out. Real men, pray and trust God to do for them every thing they themselves cannot do!

Read at least two chapters every day from Genesis to Revelation in your Bible!

Finally, Thank Him for His Blessings – Read and meditate on these verses. **Phil. 4:6** "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." **Col 4:2** "Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving." We have got a lot to be thankful for. Write some blessings on your heart and mind right now. Praise Him for His goodness to you!

Go now and have a great walk with the Lord... Every day

Personal Devotion – Thursday Morning Seeking Godly Counsel (Genesis 13)

First Read Genesis 13: We all need to have godly counsel when we make decisions. Lot is a perfect example of how often we make a decision without ever asking godly counsel from others. When the strife erupted between the shepherds of Lot and Abraham,

"The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise." Proverbs 12:15

they could have settled the arguments and figured out a solution. Abraham offered to separate their flocks and herds to different grazing lands. He gave Lot the first pick of where Lot wanted to go. Lot NEVER asked Abraham's advice. He made a hasty decision based on sight and how he would gain from the well watered plains. Lot had learned to be a shepherd and manage them and in order for his flocks to grow, they needed good grazing and water. He made a hasty decision and never looked back to Abraham. Then, Lot is captured while Sodom is at war and everything he owned was seized. Abraham rescues him, but Lot never thanks his uncle and goes right back to Sodom. He never asks Abraham if he should stay in Sodom or to leave. Lot thought he knew best with his decisions, and in the end, it cost him everything.

Some thoughts about Seeking Godly Counsel: The Bible repeatedly says to seek counsel before making decisions. The best place to go for counsel is the Word of God. Yet, God has also given you people in your life that can help you make decisions. First of all, He has given you a pastor. Seek his counsel when you need to make an important decision. He has also given you parents and those who love you. Seek their counsel. There are many other examples of hasty, foolish decisions made without counsel. Joshua made a decision in Joshua 9:14, "And the men took of their victuals, and asked not counsel at the mouth of the LORD." These men deceived Joshua and he made a vow to protect them, who God said to eliminate! Rehoboam forsook the godly counsel of the older men in 1 Kings 12 and instead listened to his buddies. His decision divided the nation of Israel! **Proverbs11:14** says, "Where no counsel is, the people fall: but in the multitude of counsellors there is safety." Don't just seek the counsel that you want to hear! Do not also not ask someone because you think you already know what they will say. Assuming is very dangerous! Other strong verses in the Bible are: Proverbs 12:15, "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise.", Proverbs 15:22, "Without counsel purposes are disappointed: but in the multitude of counsellors they are established.", Proverbs 19:20, "Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end.", and Proverbs 24:6, "... in multitude of counsellors there is safety."







Choosing The Right Direction For Our Affection

What are the choices of your affection? As you look at the life of Lot, you will notice that as a younger man, he sought to follow his Uncle Abraham. As he prospers and sees the worldliness of Egypt, Lot gets a taste for the World. There are two main areas in "Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth." Colossians 3:2

life we can put our affection towards – God or the World. 1 John 2:15-17 says, "Love not the ______, neither the things that are in the ______. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the ______, and the lust of the ______, and the ______ of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever." The Bible says that a person cannot serve two masters... they cannot love both God and the World. The Apostle James is even more challenging in James 4:4, "Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is ______ with God? whosoever therefore will be a friend of the world is the enemy of God." It is serious who we set our affection upon. God and the World are at war with each other because Satan is "the god of this world."

Lot's wrong choice cost him everything When Abraham offered Lot the first choice of places to settle, Lot allowed the lust of his eyes to make his decision for him. He saw the plains of Jordan were well-watered - they looked just like the Garden of Eden, and like Egypt. Perhaps he saw a chance for great financial gain, but he already knew that the inhabitants were very wicked sinners! Lot believed that he would be fine and that he would not become like them. Even after being rescued by Abraham when he is captured, he goes right back to Sodom and becomes very influential there. Sadly, Sodom rubbed off on his family, corrupting his daughters, having son-in-laws who did not fear God, and a wife who loved Sodom more than her own life. Lot even lingered as long as he could before the angels had to drag him out of Sodom. Lot lost his wealth, joy, family, and his integrity...but not his salvation. He ruined his life on earth, but the Bible does call him Righteous. There is only one way to overcome the world, and that is found in 1John 5:4, 5 *"For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the Son of God?"*. The world still tries to pull us back, but as long as we set our affection upon the Lord God above, the world will not be as glamorous as it appears.




