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

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

This weekend, tear down every idol that is stopping you from being godly. Because this world, our churches, and especially our families need to see more godly men!



Introducing Elijah 1 Kings 17 – 2 Kings 2 Can you fill in the missing information?

One of THE greatest prophets of all time, wrote no part of the Bible, and lived in one of the darkest times of Israel's history. His name... was **Elijah**! He was no super-hero, with the ability to stop speeding trains, but he was able to stand firmly against the wicked leaders, and the barefaced sins of the day! Most people can only talk a good talk, but Elijah acted, and did what no one thought could be done - *turn the hearts of the entire nation of Israel, back to God!* It is this man, Elijah, that we will study and learn from during this Camp.



Israel Has Turned Away from God

When Elijah shows up, the nation of Israel had been divided for 60 years since king Solomon's reign. What once was one, unified nation under God, has split into two warring countries that are nearly opposite in every way. The southern kingdom is called Judah, and really struggles to do right, often failing though, with idolatry and paganism creeping into the everyday life of the people of Judah. But the northern nation is called Israel, or the Ten Northern Tribes. Since the split, not one good king ever led Israel to follow God. The people were not interested in obeying God anymore. They only wanted to be wealthy and powerful like all the other nations around them.

And so, king after king came along, each out-doing the previous king in their sin, and causing all the people of Israel to sin. The Bible says each "*did evil in the sight of the LORD*...", "*provoking God to* ______..." until it got so bad that king Ahab "*did more to provoke the LORD God of Israel to anger than all the kings of Israel that were before him.*" This wicked king despised the Lord Jehovah, the God of Israel, and he instead committed his life to serve the demon god, **Baal**. But that was just the beginning. Ahab married a really evil woman named Jezebel, who actually is one of the most wicked women in the Bible! These two people proudly led the nation of Israel to live completely against all of God's laws. Together, they built a temple to Baal, and a special altar made for the worship of their golden god. In the end, Ahab was not only leading Israel deeper and deeper into sin and away from God – but he was leading them to righteous judgment and destruction by the hand of God!

A Prophet Arises in Israel (1Kings 17:1)

Suddenly, out of the wilderness a man named **Elijah** appears, proclaiming the coming judgment of God. "As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I stand, there shall not be ______ nor _____ these years, but according to my word." All that is known about Elijah is that he was from the village of **Tishbe**, in the area known as Gilead. His name means "God is Jehovah" and it foretells his calling and mission to point people to that very fact that the only Jehovah



is God! It must have been something to hear the name "Elijah" as he fearlessly approaches king Ahab, accusing him and Jezebel of *offending* the God of heaven and earth, declaring that it would not rain until he would say it would, as judgment for the sins of the leaders as well as the people of Israel. And then, just as suddenly as he appears, Elijah leaves Ahab, and goes to a small river named **Cherith**, where God sent him to take care of him during the drought.

Introducing Elijah



God Provides for Elijah (1 King 17:2-16)

While there, as the drought began to dry up all the land of Israel, Elijah always was able to draw water from the brook. And while there, God showed His power and commanded the ______ to bring food to Elijah. Every morning, and every evening the ______ brought Elijah bread and meat. So far so good. Elijah was enjoying the blessings of trusting God to take good care of him.

Then, after many days without any rain, anywhere,

the brook dried up. What can Elijah do now?

It was then, when the water was gone, when the brook had dried up, that God told Elijah to go to a place nearly 60 miles northwest, called **Zarephath** and that a ______ would

take care of him there. Elijah obeyed God and went to this coastal city of Zarephath. There, he meets a woman near the gates of the city and notices she is gathering sticks. He amazingly asks her for a drink of water, knowing that there simply IS no water, and that whatever water she had, would be vital for HER and her family to live on! But amazingly, she goes to get him his drink, and that is when this man of God boldly in faith in God asks for a small cake of bread, like a scone! That was when this woman reveals she is a widow, and that she only had a little bit of flour and oil, and she was going to make a small cake of bread and then starve to death. Elijah believes God will not only take care of him, but also will take care of this hopeless and helpless widow as well. So he encourages HER to trust his God, and promises her that God would make her barrel of flour and jar of _ to never run out until it rained again. The woman simply chose to trust Elijah and for over a year every time she went to make bread for Elijah and her family, she miraculously had flour and oil to do so.



A Dead Son Resurrected (1Kings 17:17-24)

As Elijah is there, living with the widow and her son, her son fell sick and became so ill that he died. His mother was so overwhelmed that she accused Elijah of bringing her past sins into remembrance and causing her son to die. Without hesitating, Elijah asked for her son and he laid him upon Elijah's bed and prayed for God to restore the boy's life. God heard Elijah's prayer and the soul of the boy returned and the boy was alive again! Elijah brought the now living boy to his mother and it was then that she knew he was truly a man of God and that whatever he spoke of the Lord was truth.

Elijah Confronts Ahab (1Kings 18:1-18)

It has not rained for three and a half years now, and severe drought and famine had spread throughout all the land of Israel. It was now time for Elijah to confront Ahab again and to pray for the rain to return.

During all the three and a half years, Ahab has been searching everywhere for Elijah. He and Jezebel had been killing off anyone who was a prophet of God. Ahab hated Elijah, and blamed him for the famine and drought, even though he knew that Elijah could restore the rain.

As Elijah heads back into Israel from Zarephath, he meets Obadiah, the governor of Ahab's house, and tells him to go and get his master and to bring him to meet face to face with Elijah. Obadiah is terrified at the sight of Elijah, fearing that Elijah will not be there when he returns. But Elijah assures Obadiah that he will stay and wait, because he must confront Ahab. Obadiah races back to the king and tells him Elijah is alive and wants to meet up with him. And



as Ahab approaches this man of God, he tries to blame Elijah for the drought, and act like Elijah is the enemy of Israel. But Elijah declares that it is because of the wickedness of Ahab and his fathers that the rain had stopped. The drought was because they had turned their back away from following the God of Israel and His commandments, and instead choosing to love Baal!

Jezebel - The Power Behind the Power (1Kings 18:13)

Now, to be sure, it was Jezebel who controlled Ahab; and it was HER god, Baal, that would be the enemy for Elijah to defeat to save the souls of God's people! She had personally brought into Israel a small army of 850 paid false prophets of Baal to completely replace all worship of the God

of Israel. And this evil woman had hunted down and killed every person who dared threaten her position of power. So, Elijah was up against a serious foe! By the way, Baal was a very evil god, worshipped by the original Canaanites, and at the time of Elijah, by the nation of Israel. Base sex worship was prevalent, and religious prostitution even commanded; human sacrifice was common; and it was a frequent practice--in an effort to keep Baal happy--to kill young children and bury them in the foundations of a house or public building at the time of its construction! THAT was how dedicated the Israelites were to Baal when Elijah stood alone on Mount Carmel.

The Fire of Mount Carmel (1Kings 18:19-46)

Elijah offers a challenge to king Ahab to gather together all the 850 prophets of Baal and to meet him at the top of Mount ______. He asks that ALL the people of Israel come and watch as Elijah's God takes on Jezebel's god! Ahab gladly agrees and they all met upon **Mount Carmel**. It was there that Elijah publically demanded that the people make a <u>decision</u> about who is God - whether it is Jehovah, or Baal, and to choose to follow one – not just sit on the side-lines!



The fact is, there are only two options. But the people would not answer. They had no interest in making such a commitment. You see, this was more than a choice of deciding who is God, but who will we obey and serve! And people only want head decisions, but never ones that change the course of our lives! So, Elijah then offers a test to PROVE who the true God Almighty is.

He asks for two sacrificial altars to be made and two bulls to be provided, and the God that answered the prayers by sending fire from heaven to consume and burn up the sacrifice, would be the true God! What a step of faith!

The prophets of Baal went first. They prepared their bull and put it on their fancy altar and began praying to their false god, Baal. But after about six hours, there was no response – no fire from the sky - nothing. So they started jumping upon the altar to show their zeal, and yet there was still no answer to their prayers. All the while, Elijah was sitting back and watching. After most of the day has passed with nothing happening, Elijah began to mock them and laugh at them, asking them to consider that maybe Baal might be sleeping and couldn't hear them. The false prophets then began to shout louder and cut themselves with knives to get Baal's attention. But, no matter how hard they tried to get Baal to respond, nothing happened.

Toward the end of the day, just before sunset, Elijah stood up called all the people to give him their undivided attention, to see what God will do. Elijah next carefully repaired the old altar of God that hadn't been used in over 100 years and then dug a trench around the altar. He carefully placed the sacrifice of his bull on top of the old altar. He then commanded that

TWELVE large barrels of water be brought up to the top of the mountain and poured on top of the bull and altar. Water was very scarce, but Elijah wanted to prove that God would consume the sacrifice and that it didn't just happen because of the dryness of the wood and a spark catching it on fire.

At this point, the altar and the bull were soaked, and the trench was filled with water. And it was then that Elijah prayed, asking God to remind all the people that HE is God, and that He has now turned their hearts back to Him! Then an amazing thing happened. A fireball from heaven fell upon the altar and consumed the sacrifice, wood, stones, and the water - removing everything - even the dust around the altar was gone!

When the people heard Elijah powerful and passionately pray, and then saw the fire fall, they were terrified and fell upon their faces to the ground and declared Jehovah to be the one true God! Elijah then stood and commanded the people to quickly capture all the



prophets of Baal and to have them killed. Ahab has been watching everything take place, and now Elijah tells him that the rain is coming. Elijah then climbs to the top of Mount Carmel. After telling his servant to look out at the sky seven times, he begins to see a small cloud form with the likeness of a hand. Elijah sends his messenger to Ahab to tell him to hasten and leave before the storm comes and he gets caught in it. The hand of the Lord comes upon Elijah and Elijah ends up running and beating Ahab, in his chariot, to **Jezreel**.

Elijah's Flight (1Kings 19:1-8)

Ahab reports to Jezebel all that Elijah had done upon Mount Carmel and that all 850 of her prophets had been killed. Jezebel now wants Elijah dead by the next day and sends Elijah a message that he had a death warrant upon his head. Elijah receives the message and instead of trusting God to continue to take care of him, he flees for his life into the desert wilderness. Elijah is so distraught over his life that he wants to die, so he sat down and asked God to kill him. But the problem was that Elijah hadn't eaten or slept for days! God sent an angel not once, but twice to feed Elijah and keep him going. Elijah eats and then sleeps. And then, Elijah started on a _____ day journey to Mount Sinai where he faced his worst problem – himself!

Introducing Elijah

Elijah's Discouragement (1Kings 19:8-18)

When he finally arrives to the Mount of God, he found a cave for shelter. When he arrived, God plainly asked him WHY he was there. Elijah is at his lowest point spiritually and in selfpity declares that he alone has been following God, and it has gotten him nowhere. God then tells him to go outside and stand upon the edge of the mountain. Elijah waits for some BIG thing to happen as God passes by the mountain. There was a fierce wind that rose up, but that was only wind – it was not God. Then a great earthquake rocked the ground, yet God was not in the earthquake. Then after the earthquake a great fire roared in front of Elijah, but God was not in the fire. Then, quietly, just after the roar of the fire calmed down, there was a "_____, ___



" voice that could just

barely be heard speaking. When Elijah heard it, he was not impressed, and instead just wrapped his face into his mantle and went back into the cave. God kindly asks him again why he was there, and again Elijah tries to justify his frustration with God and his fear of Jezebel. God then gives him several tasks to do. God was NOT finished with Elijah! He still had much work to do before coming home! One of the tasks of a man of God is to make sure he has a replacement, for when he leaves the ministry. God then reveals to Elijah that he was not alone in his zeal, and that there were ______ other prophets who still served God, just not as publically. Unfortunately, this did not really encourage Elijah!



Elijah Finds Elisha (1Kings 19:19-21)

Elijah obeys the Lord and heads out of the cave to get back into the ministry! His first assignment is to find a young man named ______, to succeed him as the next prophet for Israel. Elijah finds Elisha working hard, ploughing his fields with his own oxen. As Elijah walked by him and threw his mantle upon him, signifying that Elijah was choosing him to follow him. There were no words spoken! Elisha was one of the 7,000 who had NOT bowed his knee to worship Baal, and he instantly accepted God's call through the man of God, Elijah! After saying farewell to his parents and offering a yoke of oxen,

Elisha whole-heartedly follows Elijah. What a way to find God's will (it finds you), and then start doing God's will (following the man of God in preparation to do exactly what HE does)!

Elijah Confronts Ahab in Naboth's Vineyard (1Kings 21:1-29)

Ahab desired a vineyard that was near to his royal palace, but was owned by another man named **Naboth**. Ahab offered to give him another vineyard or to buy it for a lot of money, but Naboth did not want to give up what had been handed down to him as an inheritance from his forefathers – Naboth refused king Ahab's wishes. So, Ahab returned to the palace and actually moped around and pouted like a spoiled child not getting his way. His wife Jezebel saw that something was bothering him and when she discovered the reason, she hatched a plan to have Naboth *murdered*. With Naboth dead, his land could be confiscated by the king! All the elders of the city did as Jezebel planned, and set Naboth up for ruin. Naboth was falsely accused of blasphemy against the gods, and then was stoned just outside the city gates. Jezebel then proudly gives the vineyard to her spoiled, brat husband, Ahab.

All the while, God was watching everything that happened to Naboth, and told Elijah to now go and confront Ahab about this murder. As soon as Ahab sees Elijah, he accuses him of still being his enemy. Elijah replied that the only reason he is his enemy is because of Ahab selling himself over to do evil in plain sight of the Lord. Elijah then foretells of the doom and destruction that will happen to Ahab, Jezebel, and all their children. He informs Ahab that where the dogs licked the blood of Naboth, that they would lick his blood as well. Elijah prophesied that Jezebel will end up being eaten by dogs by the wall of Jezreel, and that the entire family of Ahab will be eliminated. When Ahab heard the judgment upon him for all of his sin, surprisingly he humbled himself by rending his royal clothes, fasting, and putting on sackcloth as a sign to God that he was sorry and repentant. The Lord saw Ahab's heart and told Elijah that because of Ahab humbling himself, He now would not destroy all the family of Ahab in right now, but later on, during his son's reign. And just as Elijah predicted, wicked Jezebel was thrown out of a high window, and died, and she was almost completely eaten by the dogs!

Ahab's Son, Ahaziah Seeks to Kill Elijah (2Kings 1:1-17)

Ahaziah, Ahab's son, is now king of Israel. He has an accident at his palace in which he falls through the lattice in his upper chamber. Because of his injury, he becomes ill. Ahaziah is concerned about dying and instead of turning to the Lord God Jehovah, he instead sends a messenger to a priest of his own god, Baal-zebub, the god of the Ekronites. God sent Elijah to meet the messenger and to go back and tell young king Ahaziah that he will soon die. The messenger returned and gave Ahaziah the news from Elijah. The messengers did not know that it was Elijah that they had talked to, but when they described his appearance, Ahaziah knew immediately who it was.

Ahaziah hated Elijah, and instantly sent a company of _______ soldiers to capture Elijah, and bring him before king Ahaziah. When they found Elijah sitting on top of a hill, the captain mockingly called him a "man of God" and demanded him to come down from the hill and be taken into custody. Elijah responds that IF he IS a man of God, then fire will surely come down from heaven and consume them all that moment. And right then, fire did come down and killed all of the soldiers. Ahaziah then sent another company of 51 soldiers, and the exact same thing happens. Finally, Ahaziah sends a third company. This time the captain of those 50 soldiers falls down upon his knees before Elijah and asked for the life of his men be spared. An angel then told Elijah to go with this captain and that he would be safe with him. Elijah meets Ahaziah and again rebukes king Ahaziah by asking if the reason that he had sent to inquire of Baal-zebub is because there is no God in Israel to ask help from. Elijah then tells him personally that he is going to die from the illness, and it so happens. With the death of Ahaziah, Jehoram, Ahaziah's brother, becomes king.

Elijah and the Chariot of Fire (2Kings 2:1-18)

After more than 20 years of serving the Lord, preaching, healing, and helping the people, it was time for Elijah to leave this world. Elijah knew that his time of departure was at hand and desired to one last time visit the schools of the prophets, called the "sons of the prophets" and encourage the young men to stand for God and against the culture of Israel in that time. As Elijah walked towards the desert, he commanded Elisha to stay behind and not follow him, three time. But Elisha knew that Elijah was about to leave, so he would not let Elijah leave his presence in case he just disappeared! They travelled to from Gilgal to Bethel and finally to Jericho. When they left Jericho, Elijah and Elisha came to the Jordan River. There, Elijah took off his mantle and smote the water with it, and the water divided in two so that they could walk over to the other side on dry ground. Elijah asked Elisha what one last thing he wanted him to do for him. Elisha asked for a double portion of Elijah's spirit to be upon him! Elijah was

surprised! He knew it was a difficult request and told him that if he saw him when the Lord took him, that his request would be granted.

As the two continue to walk on together and talk, suddenly without any warning, a blazing fiery chariot led by *horses of fire* appeared in the sky! The chariot swept down and ripped the two prophets apart from each other, taking Elijah up into the sky in a whirlwind and into heaven.

Elisha saw everything and in his grief and morning, rent his clothes out of sorrow for losing such a great man of God. But, amazingly, Elijah's mantle had fallen from him when he was taken in the whirlwind, and so Elisha grabbed it and began his own ministry of serving the Lord, asking, "Where is the LORD God of Elijah?" (2Kings 2:14). And with those words, he smote the Jordan river with the mantle and watched it split just as it had for Elijah, and did exactly twice the number of miracles that Elijah did, and even served God over twice as long!

Read 2 Kings chapters 2-13 for the life of Elisha.

You will find a young man who:



- 1. Accepted the call of God to stand almost alone again in Israel, like Elijah had, standing against the culture, the politics, and the king himself at times;
- 2. Prayed and walked passionately and powerfully with God;
- 3. Continued the work of Elijah, being a godly example for the men of Israel to follow;
- 4. Did exactly twice the number of miracles that Elijah did, helping widows and the nation know that Jehovah God was still there for them;
- 5. And influenced Ahab's grandson, Jehoram, for good when Jehoram became king.

It is amazing what TWO men can do for a nation, when they seek to be filled with God's spirit, are not afraid of men, and are not satisfied until they have done their best, praying, preaching, interceding, and living for God, no matter the cost!

A Man's Quiet Time How Does a Real Man Walk with His God?

Please read this simple explanation of how to prepare your heart for a daily serious time with God through His word. It will make all the difference in the world to come humbly before the throne of grace. **Hebrews 4:16.** We need God's help!

Start with Prayer! Find yourself a place every day to get alone with God. Remember Matthew 6:6 "But thou, when thou prayest, enter into thy closet..." It is when we are by ourselves seeking the Lord that we hear His still, small voice. Start with opening your heart to God. Allow Him to do an inspection of what is in your thoughts and feelings. Psalm 139:23 says, "Search me, O God, and know my heart: try me, and know my thoughts." Be honest with yourself, and honest with God. Ask God to search for any sins you may have buried in your heart. Psalm 139:24 says, "And see if there be any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting." David, realizing he had sinned against God, asked for a cleansing. God wants us all very clean in our hearts! Psalm 51:2 says, "Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin." Let God cleanse your life as you do the following three things: 1. Acknowledge - admit the sins He reveals are there in your heart. 2. Confess - admit that you have sinned before an all holy God. 3. Forsake - leave each sin, abandoning everything that has separated you from God. Decide by God's power to quit doing the same sins that God reveals to you in your quiet time, and has already forgiven, and cleansed you from. Remember the Lord's promise – 1 John 1:9 "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us *our* sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

Humble yourself. The Bible says in Isaiah 57:15a, "For thus saith the high and lofty One that inhabiteth eternity, whose name is Holy; I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit..." We have a great need every day to humble ourselves as we prepare to walk with God. This means there must be a **personal brokenness** to cause us to always depend upon the Lord. God wants to fully "dwell" in our heart, but He will not force His way in, nor will He honour a sinful, wicked heart. Once your heart is clean, tell God you are coming under His perfect authority, and that you want to obey Him all day long. God desires to fellowship with you, but only with the right attitude!

<u>Tell God what you need!</u> Cast all your worries, cares, and every need upon Almighty God. He loves to answer our impossible prayers! He delights to have our strength renewed in our daily walk with Him. Believe God wants to give you a peace and strength far beyond what we are used to. So, pray about everything! Real men don't fight, get angry, frustrated, and defeated when things don't work out. Real men, pray and trust God to do for them every thing they themselves cannot do!

<u>Read at least two chapters</u> every day from Genesis to Revelation in your Bible!

Finally, Thank Him for His Blessings – Read and meditate on these verses. **Philp 4:6** "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God." **Col 4:2** "Continue in prayer, and watch in the same with thanksgiving." We have got a lot to be thankful for. Write some blessings on your heart and mind right now. Praise Him for His goodness to you!

Go now and have a great walk with the Lord... Every day

Personal Devotion – Thursday Morning *Standing in God's Presence*

As a Christian you don't just wake up each day a spiritual person without some basic disciplines in your life. Neither did the prophet Elijah. When he comes on the scene in 1Kings 17 he already has a walk with God. Do you? How is your walk with God TODAY? Take a brief look at Elijah...

"And Elijah the Tishbite, ... said unto Ahab, As the LORD God of Israel liveth, before whom I

And Elijah said, As the LORD of hosts liveth, before whom I" 1st Kings17:1; 18:15

____••••

Elijah's walk with God was based on the same fundamental things that should be in our lives.

- Obedience! 1Kings 17:2-5 Vs. 5 "So he went and _____ according unto the word of the LORD..." 1Kings17:9,10 Elijah is told to go to Zarephath. In verse 10 we read the following "So he ______ and _____ to Zarephath." Elijah _____ God! Elijah had a habit of obeying God. Obedience is a good first step in your personal walk with God.
- 2. **Prayer!** Read James 5:17,18. Who was James referring to? ______ What was it that Elijah had a habit of doing? ______. Elijah prayed and it didn't rain for three years. He prayed again and it did rain. Elijah prayed a prayer of 63 words in 1 Kings 18 and fire came down from heaven. Evidently, Elijah was a praying man!
- 3. **LISTEN to your Bible!** 1Kings 19:12,13 "...and after the fire a still, small ______. And it was so, when Elijah _______ it..." Did you notice that Elijah heard from God! Are you reading and learning your Bible so as to HEAR from God? He speaks through the words on the pages of a Bible!
- 4. Trust God every day, in every way! Elijah had to constantly trust God.
 - a. He had to trust every day where? ______ (1 Kings 17:1-7)
 - b. He had to believe God with who? ______ (1 Kings 17:8-24)
 - c. He had to believe God when facing who? ______ (1 Kings 18)
 - d. And Elijah had to believe God for what? ______(1 Kings 18:41-46)!
- 5. **Be a** ______ **of God!** (2Kings 1:6-15). Over and over we find these words about Elijah... Vs.9, 11, 13 "... ______ *of God*..." Do you consider yourself a man of God? Or just a man of the world? What do others see in you? Even Elijah's enemies saw him as a man of God. This world could really use some men to stand up in the power of God and be like Elijah Men of God!

Some other important things to remember to be doing...

- Stay clean from the filth of the world But, if you get dirty (and will to some extent) remember the **two** things to do in Proverbs 28:13; 1John 1:9
 - ______ sin
 - _____ the sin
 - And let God clean you up again!
- Remember you are not alone (1Kings 19:18). Others are walking the same path with you.
- Be fearless! Elijah like us all had his time of doubts, sense of being alone, and fearful. If Christian men feared only God, we wouldn't fear standing for Christ in this world.

Conclusion: God is calling men to make up their mind to walk in step with Him and not the world anymore. What is YOUR decision going to be? Will you make a decision during this Men's Camp Meeting (maybe right now?) to get right with God and walk with Him daily?

Personal Devotion – Friday Morning The Fruit of Personal Revival

You must have 2 attitudes for personal revival to happen:

- 1. A spirit of **humility** that puts God and others before self. (Read James 4:6,7; and Matt 22:36-40)
- 2. A contriteness towards personal **sin**, desiring to be forgiven and clean. (Read 1 John 1:9)

Read James 5:17. The Bible tells us that Elijah was "*a man subject to like _____ as we are*." That

simply means he was easily affected by the same worldly influences and the ways and weaknesses of his own heart just like we are.

What is revival?

For the Christian – Revival is being restored to the way of living and thinking like you were the day you got saved. It brings you back to total submission to God, a total resolve, humbled, dependent on God again, thankful. It simply is a return to life from a state of apathy and death.



- 1. James 5:17 tell us Elijah prayed _____! Do you pray zealously and eagerly? Are you talking and listening to God every day? This will cause you to be a passionate follower of Jesus Christ. Do you desire for personal revival? **YES**, or **NO**?
- 2. Elijah obeyed God 1Kings 17:5 So he went and ______ according unto the word of the LORD: My friend you never experience revival till Jesus Christ is Lord in your life. Let go of the other gods in your life; (friends, money, hobbies, YOU...) and give Jesus first place. Obedience is what we see in Elijah's life and ministry.
- 3. 1 Kings 18:30 Elijah prepared and rebuilt the _____. You have got to have a place (an altar) where you meet with God and worship. That place is where you spend time with God praying, and sacrificing every fear, and every effort for God's honour. Where is YOUR altar? _____.
- 4. Read 1Kings 17:3-6,9. Personal revival means ______ God. Trusting God is a sign that a man is being guided by the Spirit of God. To be led of the Spirit shows a person who is humbled, dependent and contrite of spirit. This is a person who is living by the life of the Spirit and that is revival. Christian men yielding to the Spirit of God experience personal revival every day!

Why do YOU need personal revival?

Every day, you are choosing whether you will go against God or against the flow of the world. Read 1Kings 18:18,21. Are you like the Israelites? "...*How long halt ye between two opinions? if the LORD be God, ______: but if Baal, then follow him. And the people answered him not a word.*" Are you hesitant to make up your mind? If you want revival, you will have to choose to go against the right pressures! Which flow was Elijah going against? You will need a revival of heart and courage to go against today's culture.

Did Israel finally make the right choice? **YES**, or **NO**? Have you made the right choice? **YES**, or **NO**?
