#### **Rules You Have to Obey While At Camp**

- Every Scripture verse you memorize, you get 200 points!
- If you memorize all the 7 key verses (in yellow) you get 1,000 Extra points!
- If you memorize ALL the verses, you will get 5,000 extra points on top of them!
- The first <u>full team</u> present and seated for Chapel gets 1,000 points!
- Every Team Cheer, or Skit will get points for that team based on how good they are!
- Clean Bunks will result in 500 points being given to the person.
- A completed Bible Word Dictionary will result in 3,000 points for that person.
- Every Sermon or lesson that you take a full page of notes on will get you 1000 pts.
- Every Devotion Page completed will get 1000 points.
- Every time the Camp Director sees a person with great zeal, they will get 1000 pts.

#### Losing Points – unless stated, breaking any of these rules has a limit of 3 warnings

- Every time someone on your team has a bad attitude, breaks a rule, or gets into a fight, they will lose 1,000 points.
- Every bed must be made and every room cleaned before breakfast or else each person who leaves a messy bunk will lose 500 points.



#### The Life of Simon Peter

Have you ever done something in your life that made you feel like you are a complete failure? Perhaps even something that if your parents were to find out, you would be ashamed of it. Sometimes we are led to believe that if you are a Christian that you will never have failures and make bad decisions and mistakes. Some even expect perfection if you are a Christian. Because of our sinful nature, we will never be perfect and incapable of making mistakes and wrong decisions. Even though being perfect and sinless is an impossibility, we ought to strive to always do the right thing and obey God's Word and our parents. Peter is a unique character, especially among the other disciples. He is brash, yet brave. He is a natural leader, yet he made many mistakes. He is at times full of faith, and at times broken and unsure of his faith. He is a man that when he allows "Peter" to be the boss of his life, he often fails. But when he yields himself to God to mould him like a potter does with the clay, God brings about a useful vessel that brings Him honour and glory. As you learn about the life of Peter, you will find some similarities even to your own life as you learn to also yield your life to the Master's hands.

Background: Peter was from the city of Bethsaida. He was the son of a man named Jonas. Not much is known about his immediate family besides having a brother named Andrew, who would also become one of Jesus' disciples. The Bible reveals that he and Andrew moved to Capernaum. Peter was married. The scriptures do not reveal his wife's name, but there was an eventful time with her mother staying with them. She had come down very sick with a fever and Jesus healed her of it. By trade, Peter and Andrew were fishermen and they often worked with another pair of brothers, James and John Zebedee. These other brothers would also join Jesus as His disciples. Peter sometime goes by different names. His original Jewish name is Simon but Jesus later changed his name to Peter, and then also to Cephas, which means a stone.



His Life-Changing Encounter With Jesus: The gospel of John reveals that after Jesus was baptised and John the Baptist declared Jesus to be the lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world, Andrew overheard it. Andrew immediately went and brought his brother, Simon Peter, to meet Jesus. At this first meeting is when Jesus gave him the name of Cephas. After meeting Jesus, Andrew and Peter returned to their home in Capernaum and back to fishing. Jesus eventually came to Capernaum and was a guest in Peter's home is when He heals Peter's mother-in-law of the deadly fever. Jesus also did several miracles in Capernaum and departed to preach in other places in Galilee.

In **Luke 5**, the event is told of a miracle that happens with Peter and Andrew, and Peter's conversion to Christ. Jesus returned to Capernaum and was speaking to a large group of people along the seashore. Andrew, Peter, James, and John had come in from the lake after fishing all night long. Jesus spotted them washing their nets and asked if He could get on their boat and go out a little from the shore so everyone could better hear Him speak. Upon

finishing His preaching, Jesus told Peter to go out further into the deeper part of the Sea of Galilee and to let the nets down.

Peter was exhausted from fishing all night and frustrated that he didn't catch a single fish. He probably found Jesus' request a bit annoying and an inconvenience. Peter probably wanted to just wash his nets and go home and get some rest. But even though he was tired, he obeyed Jesus' request. As soon as he put down the nets, the fish came. Insomuch that their nets began to break for the multitude. They called out to John and James, and they came with their boat and helped them bring up the nets of fish. There were so many fish that both boats began to start sinking.

Upon seeing this great miracle and as a career fisherman of the sea, he knew he just experienced a divine occurrence. He immediately fell upon his knees before Jesus and declared his acknowledgment of being a sinner and needing a Saviour. He knew he shouldn't even be in Jesus' presence because of his sinful state. It was this defining moment that changed the life of Peter and made him a follower of Jesus Christ. They brought the boats to shore and from that moment on all four of the fishermen left behind their career and their lives as they knew them. Jesus gave them the assurance and promise that from that moment, they would catch men instead of fish.

His Faith & Zeal: Peter changed after his encounter with Jesus. But he still had parts of his own character that he would need to let Jesus shape and mould. He was an outspoken individual and often put his foot in his mouth, but he also was exemplary in demonstrating his faith. Peter became one of Jesus' most trusted disciples and experienced events with Jesus that very few had the opportunity to do. Usually it was only Peter, James, and John who would accompany Jesus at certain times.

One great example of Peter's faith is found in **Matthew 14:22-33**. Jesus went up a mountain to pray and told the disciples to go across the Sea of Galilee and that He would meet up with

them on the other side. While crossing the sea, a storm emerged and amidst the raging of the sea, they saw Jesus walking on the water across the sea. Thinking it a ghost, they called out. When they heard Jesus' voice, they realised it was Him. Peter called out that if it is indeed Jesus, invite him to join Him on the sea. Jesus did and Peter stepped out of the boat and began to walk on the water to Jesus. Peter took his eyes off of Jesus and onto the storm that was raging around him and he immediately began to sink. He cried out to Jesus for help and immediately Jesus was there to help him. Many people are critical of Peter's lack of being able to keep his focus on the Lord. Instead, think about how he was the only one of the 12 disciples who got out of the boat and is the only other person to have walked on water.



Peter was the first of the disciples to acknowledge their belief in Jesus being the Messiah and that Jesus spoke the words of life. He also was very protective and zealous for Jesus. An example of this is when Jesus was about to be captured in the garden of Gethsemane.

Peter took a sword and attacked one of the men, cutting off their ear. Jesus healed the man and then told Peter to put the sword away.

His Failure: During the evening of celebrating the Passover meal, Jesus spoke some troubling news to His disciples. He informed them that one of them would betray Him. After Judas left, Jesus brought the remaining disciples to the mount of Olives and to the garden of Gethsemane. Along the way, Jesus revealed to them that they all would soon be offended and would forsake Him. Peter declared quite brashly that he would never be offended by Jesus. Jesus then told him that before the rooster would crow twice, he would three times deny even knowing Him. Peter declared that he would sooner die than deny knowing Jesus. Later that night Jesus is taken prisoner and all the disciples fled. John and Peter followed discreetly while Jesus was being passed from person to person and being interviewed and judged. Through a series of encounters with people, Peter ends up denying Jesus three times. After the third time, Jesus and Peter made eye contact and the rooster crowed the second



time. Peter realized he had done exactly as Jesus said he would do, and he ran off weeping with a broken heart for what he had done.

His Forgiveness: Jesus has been crucified and has now been dead for three days. Peter and the remaining 10 disciples are in hiding, fearing the Jews would come for them next. Suddenly in burst some women

and in their excited state they declared that the stone had been rolled away from Jesus' tomb. Jesus was gone and that angels told them He had risen from the dead! The angel even told the women to tell Peter specifically that Jesus had risen. This was hard news to take in and many didn't believe them. Peter and John ran out the door to the tomb. John outran Peter but stopped outside. Peter kept going and inspected the tomb, bewildered at what it all meant.

Sometime soon, 1 Corinthians 15:5 reveals that Jesus appeared to Peter alone and then later to the remaining disciples. No one knows what transpired at this appearing to Peter, but sometime soon after Peter decided to go back to fishing. He was still broken regarding his own betrayal of Jesus and had not forgiven himself over it. Instead of fixing that, he yielded to his flesh and went back to what he took comfort in doing as a profession. His decision to go back to fishing and his old life affected six others and they went with him. Jesus knew it was time to confront Peter and He went to the shore for another divine appointment. All that night they again caught nothing, just like the night before Peter put his faith in Jesus. Jesus was subtly reminding Peter of that event. Jesus waited on the shore and called out to them if they had caught anything, and He gave them instruction once again. They followed His instructions and cast their nets and caught a great multitude of fish. John immediately remembered what had happened before and he knew that it was Jesus. Peter, upon hearing that, grabbed his coat and jumped into the water and swam to shore. He helped

bring the net to shore and they had a fish fry. This was the third time Jesus showed Himself to His disciples.

After they finished the meal, Jesus got to the focus of the issue – Peter's heart. Before the events of the crucifixion, Jesus told Peter in Luke 22:31, 32 "...Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren." It was now time for a confrontation with Peter. Jesus asked Peter plainly what he loved more. Was it fish or Jesus? Peter was probably surprised by such a question and of course replied



that he loved Jesus more. Jesus then told him to feed His lambs. But then Jesus asked it a second time! Peter repeated his answer. Then Jesus asked it a third time! By now, Peter's heart was under conviction, especially after being asked three times if he truly loved Jesus. It was this point that a change happened in Peter's heart. His heart was completely converted to Christ then, especially after Jesus explained to him how he would end up dying.



His Finish: Forty days after Jesus' resurrection had now come and gone. Jesus had just ascended to Heaven in front of all the disciples. Jesus told them to wait for the Holy Spirit to come upon them and it soon followed afterwards. That very day of it happening, called Pentecost, Peter got up and preached to the multitude in Jerusalem and 3,000 trusted Christ and were baptised. Peter's adventures continued throughout the book of Acts and he was an instrumental part and leader of the Christian faith. He was miraculously delivered from prison by an angel and even had the unique opportunity to witness to a Gentile Centurion, Cornelius, and his family and see them getting saved. He watched God open the door of salvation to the Gentiles.

Peter's Death: Peter kept the faith until the day he died a martyr's death, just as was foretold by Jesus. The Bible doesn't tell us exactly how Peter died. Most Christian historians agree that Peter was crucified upside-down in Rome around 68 AD by the command of Emperor Nero. It is said that, when Peter was being crucified, he requested to be crucified on an upside down cross because he had



denied his Lord, and did not consider himself worthy to die as Jesus had. Again, this is only a tradition, and the Bible doesn't confirm or deny the story.

**Peter's Legacy:** Today, we get to read about Peter all throughout the New Testament. God used him to write two books of the Bible. Peter also mentored a young man by the name of John Mark, and it would be John Mark who would write the Gospel of Mark.

## Introducing Peter – A Follower of Jesus of Nazareth

**Matthew 4:18-20** And Jesus, walking by the sea of Galilee, saw two brethren, Simon called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea: for they were fishers. And he saith unto them, Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men. And they straightway left their nets, and followed him.

# Tuesday Morning Time with God Following Jesus! (Read Matthew 4:17-20)

Jesus has just come out of the desert after fasting for how many days? That's a long time! And Jesus had been tempted to sin by who? Did Jesus give into any of the temptations? Yes /No. Jesus then begins to tell everyone they need to repent and get right with God! Why? Because they (just like all of us) have sinned against God, and because God's judgment was coming!  Jesus meets some men on a lake shore called the Sea of Galilee. Jesus then told them to stop whatever they were doing, and leave it behind, spend time with Him and learn from Him the right way to live. That is what it means to be a Disciple! It is more than just going to church on a Sunday for a few hours. Who does Jesus meet first? Jesus saw two brothers, who were they? and And what were they were busy doing? If you were busy doing something you thought was very important, would you stop and follow someone you don't really know very well, just because you were told to? Yes / No. But Peter and Andrew did!  Jesus told them both to " me." What do you think that means? me."
Do people follow other people? Yes they do. They are called "fans" - the word fan is short for fanatic, or "follower" – and "fans" loves someone so much that they want to be with them, and learn from them, and be just like them! Who do people "follow" and want to be like today? Do you find it hard to walk away from following them?  But "following" JESUS is more important than following anyone else!
1. Being a Disciples means putting Jesus in our lives. He is the most important person in the universe! He needs to be the most important person to you! He should be the first Person we talk to in the morning, when we wake up. He should be the first person we talk to when we have been hurt, or are sad. He must be the first Person that we think of when we need an example of what to do each day.
2. Leave some things Peter and Andrew did the right thing when they stopped what they were doing and followed Jesus when He called them. Right? Yes / No. Does God call us? Read Matthew 11:28,29. Are there things you do that might get in the way of following Jesus? Write down some special interests or hobbies you participate in, like sports, or cooking, or sewing:
Could friends get in the way? Do you have friends that you spend a lot of time with? Yes / No. What would you do if someone told you to give up something you really enjoy? You might be a little sad, right? But what if they told you that by letting go of that one hobby you love, or that friend, you would become really great at doing something different? Something better. If you want to follow Jesus, you might need to walk away from some things, and some people. If soccer games are always on Sunday mornings when church gathers together, you will have to skip the match so you can attend Sunday School and church, if you are going to be a Disciple and follow Jesus. Sports are not wrong. But Jesus must be first. If your job wants you to do something that goes against God's rules, you will have to seek out a different job – that's what disciples do – we choose not to sin against God. If your hobby (X-Box) is taking up so much time and attention that it takes the place of prayer and Bible reading and worship, you will need to make less time for that hobby, so you can make more time for Jesus. Do you agree? Yes / No.  Read Luke 9:23-25 and talk about what it costs us to follow Jesus, and what it will cost us if we don't!
3. Lastly, Let Jesus you into something Jesus told Peter He would help him fish for what? What did He mean by that? It sounds a little strange, doesn't it? But people are like fish and need to hear about what Jesus taught, and what He did for them when He died on the cross! They need to be caught by faith. And they need US to go tell them! Have YOU decided to follow Jesus? If not, would you like to decide that today? Yes / No

#### Wednesday Morning Time With God **Are You Listening?**

"He that hath ears to hear, let him hear." Matthew 11:15

Jesus spent most of His time teaching people about God. Peter and the other disciples got to sit right next to Jesus as He taught thousands of people. But many times, Peter

was not paying attention to what Jesus was saying, and that got him into trouble sometimes. List some things that Jesus taught about:

Are all those things easy to understand? Yes / No. We won't understand what Jesus is teaching unless we are listening very carefully when we read the Bible. It is called, paying close attention.

Read Matthew 16:21-23. Did Peter like what Jesus said? Do you think Peter understood what Jesus

said was about to happen? There is a difference between hearing someone talk, and actually listening to them, and understanding them. Peter did not understand what Jesus was saying, and was rebuked by Jesus for trying to stop Him from going to Jerusalem to die for us. He should have been listening better
Let's Learn How to Listen to Jesus Today and Everyday  1. Find a quiet place. The Bible is God speaking to us, using His words. And it is a very quiet Book isn't it? It does not scream at us. It needs us to be in a quiet place so that we can listen to every word as we read every chapter. Where would be the quietest place in your home early in the morning?  Could you go there, and read a few chapters of the Bible there? Yes / No.  2. Read Sometimes we are in a hurry and can't hear what God is saying. So read the Bible out loud to yourself, at normal talking speed. If it is hard to understand, maybe read a little slower paying attention to every word. Where are you reading in your Bible?
Do you read the Bible out loud? Yes / No. Try it next time.
3sitting with Jesus, and listening as if He was actually talking to you. Do you ever imagine you are somewhere, or with someone? When you open your Bible where you left off reading last, imagine Jesus is sitting right next to you, and talking to you about everything you are reading.
4. Ask yourself as you read, to make sure you are understanding. Peter and

## Thursday Morning Time With God The Testing of a Disciple

How can you become a real disciple of Jesus? Can you just decide, "I will follow Jesus," and ... BOOM

... it is done? Or is there more to it than that? Think about it a minute. If you wanted to be a doctor, can you just one day decide that you are going to be a doctor and ... BOOM ... you start seeing patients and giving out medicines? No, of course not. There is much WORK involved after you make a decision. You have to first finish secondary school, then go on to university, then medical school, then there are internships where you work with other doctors, and then you have your own surgery, and are a full doctor! In the middle of all that, you have loads of tests and exams. Why? To PROVE you understand health and sickness and medicines, so you can do the job of being a doctor. Because peoples' lives will depend upon you. It is the same with being a disciple of Jesus. When a person understands they are sinners and in trouble with God, they are ready to get saved. Jesus did all the work God demanded so that all you and I had to do was believe the Gospel, and ask Jesus to save us (Romans 10:13)! Can you explain what the Gospel is? That decision to ask Jesus to save you made you born again. But we have only begun to follow Jesus. It is like getting married... the man and the woman say "I do" and are married, but they begin to work hard at making the marriage grow! So, once a person gets saved, they need to start adding things to their life so that they can grown and become more and more like Jesus. These things are described in 2Peter 1:5-8. As you try and add to your faith all those things, the devil will try and knock them back out of your life. It is like an aggressive game where every time you pick up something, your opponent tries to knock it down. The test is whether we keep trying to pick it up again, and hold onto it no matter what. Try it! Try and pick up 10 things off the ground while someone else tries to stop you. It is not easy. That is what it is like being tested as a follower of Jesus, who keeps trying to add things to their life. So, what does Peter say to add AFTER we have put our faith in Jesus' work on the cross? and making the right choices. It is not easy What is that? Virtue is \_ to do right when others do wrong. It is like a test. And Peter was tested a lot as a disciple! When Jesus told Peter to follow Him, Peter had to choose the right thing to do. Thankfully, Peter passed that test by leaving his \_\_\_\_\_ and his \_\_\_\_ and following Jesus for the rest of his life! But when Peter tried walking on (read Matthew 14:23-30), he was able to for a little while! But remember, Peter was surrounded by a raging storm with crashing waves and high winds! That scared him. And his confidence in Jesus was tested! And that's when he decided to stop looking at Jesus and started being scared of the storm, and sank straight down! Thankfully \_\_\_\_\_ quickly grabbed Peter, and walked him back to the boat, safe and sound! Peter forgot that Jesus was there to help him pass every test. We all usually fail being good disciples without Jesus' help. Peter just needed to keep trusting that Jesus is always \_\_\_\_\_, and always \_\_\_\_\_, and will make \_\_\_\_\_ work out for good! Peter had one other time that he was really tested. Read Matthew 26:57,58, 69-75. Angry men surrounded Jesus, grabbed Him and tied His hands with ropes and then began to drag Him away from the Garden of Gethsemane. Peter did not know that this was a test of his trust in God. He quickly grabbed his sword and tried to attack one of those bad men, but Jesus \_\_\_\_\_ him, and said, "put the sword away, and trust Me!" Peter dropped his sword and ran away because he became confused and afraid! And later, when Peter was accused three times of being a disciple of Jesus... which should have been a good thing to be known as, Peter denied even knowing Jesus every time! And that's when Jesus looked at Peter and Peter felt so ashamed! He had failed big time! It was the worst failure! He had been embarrassed of being a disciple of Jesus. Peter obviously had to add some things to his faith in Jesus, and choose to do the right thing, even

when doing the right thing doesn't make sense, or when we are confused, or disappointed, or scared, or when everyone else around us is doing wrong. So the next time others around you are doing wrong, will you stand strong in your faith in Jesus by obeying and pleasing Him and not the world around you? Can you stand true and make right choices when those around you are not? Jesus will help you!

# Friday Morning Time With God Becoming a Soul-Winner (A Fisher of men)

When Peter was a young boy, he had been taught how to catch fish. He was good at it. When he got
older, he owned his own boats and worked along side his brother catching fish and selling them for a
living. But then Jesus came and taught Peter how to catch for heaven! That is what soul-
winning is – catching people's hearts with the Gospel, and getting them to come and follow Jesus.
We have learned this week that Jesus calls believer to not only follow Him, and want to be like
Him, but to be ", and get them to follow Him too (read Matthew 4:19;
Matthew 16:24). But how do we "catch men"? It is a lot like catching fish, only better!
, and the second se
Let's read Luke 5:1,2. Jesus needed His disciples to go fishing for the souls of the men and women
who were hungry for the word of God! He could do it all day long, but wanted them to do it too.
Notice that fishermen back then used big, round to catch fish (Luke 5:2). Some fishermen today
still use big nets. We usually use fishing poles. Nets catch loads of fish, while poles catch one at a time.
Jesus used fishing boat to teach how to fish for souls? (Luke 5:3).
Peter had just spent all night fishing, and thought he was finished, but Jesus needed him to go out into
the water once more, and to take Him with him on the boat. So Peter does as Jesus said.
Jesus then asked Peter in Luke 5:4 to go than he felt like. Peter had rowed out a little
way into the lake, but Jesus asked him to row much further out into the deep waters, and to cast out his
big, round nets once again into the waters for a catch of fish (a draught).
Read Luke 5:5. Simon Peter is confused. He has worked all night long trying to catch fish in those
same waters and caught But, what did Peter decide to do anyways?
Read Luke 5:6,7. And that was when the fish swam into Peter's nets, and pulled them down so hard
that the nets started to rip and break! There were so many fish that boats couldn't hold them all!
Read Luke 5:8,9. Catching all those fish humbled Peter, and embarrassed him. He was so confident
that he was a great fisherman. But Peter now understood if any fish were going to be caught from now
on, it was that would bring them. All Peter was supposed to do was to throw out the net. He had
to learn that if men's hearts were going to be caught, it would not be with Peter's abilities, but Jesus'.
Read Luke 5:10,11. Catching men is a miracle. Peter, and James, and John were afraid of what they
•
just experienced. Fish don't normally jump INTO nets. But Jesus said, don't be afraid. If Jesus can
help Peter catch hundreds of big fish so easily, He can help anybody catch loads of men's hearts as
well! And that was when they brought their ships to the shore, and left them behind, with all those fish
in them, and just followed Jesus, looking forward to catching some big souls!
Some final thoughts
1. Make sure you have some good – something important to say to someone
that they are hungry for – like the Gospel. Make sure you can explain the Gospel.
2. Carry some They explain the Gospel to people who are too busy to
listen to you at any moment. Give tracts to everyone. It's like casting a net into the sea!
3. Don't worry if someone doesn't want to know about Jesus at the moment. They
·
just aren't yet. When you go fishing, there are certain times when the fish will not bite
because they are not hungry. Wait a while. There will be a time when that person will be looking for
God, and maybe you will be there to catch their soul!
4 people to church to hear the Gospel some more. You can't invite fish into the net
(they don't understand English), but you can invite people to come to church or Sunday School.
5. Ask people to to follow Jesus just like you are! Whenever you share the gospel with
